

8 colors of optical fiber cable

Article Overview

The standard colors for an 8-core optical fiber cable follow the first eight colors of the TIA-598-C/D sequence: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate (Gray), White, Red, and Black.

Standard Color Sequence

For an 8-core fiber optic cable, each fiber is color-coded to allow easy identification during installation, splicing, and maintenance. According to the TIA/EIA-598-C and TIA-598-D standards, the first eight colors in the 12-color sequence are:

- o Blue
 - o Orange
 - o Green
 - o Brown
 - o Slate (Gray)
 - o White
 - o Red
 - o Black
- These colors are applied to the individual fiber strands inside the cable, typically on the buffer coating, to ensure each fiber can be uniquely identified without confusion .

Additional Notes

- o 12-Color Sequence: For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence continues with Yellow, Violet, Rose, and Aqua, and then repeats with stripes for higher-count cables .
- o Outer Jacket Color: The cable jacket color indicates the fiber type (e.g., yellow for single-mode, orange for OM1/OM2 multimode, aqua for OM3/OM4 multimode) and is separate from the internal fiber strand colors .
- o Connector Identification: Connector body or boot colors correspond to fiber type and polish (UPC or APC), which is critical for proper mating and minimizing signal loss . Using this standardized color coding ensures error-free fiber identification, reduces mis-splicing, and maintains consistency across installations globally.
