France has rapidly expanded fiber optic (FTTH) coverage, with over 92% of premises connectable and gigabit-speed internet widely available, as part of the national France Tres Haut Debit plan.

Overview of Fiber Optic Technology

Fiber optic communication transmits data as pulses of light through ultra-thin glass or plastic strands, offering extremely high speeds, low latency, and minimal signal degradation over distance, unlike traditional copper networks . In France, the preferred technology is FTTH (Fiber To The Home), where a dedicated optical cable runs directly to a small wall socket (PTO) inside the home, ensuring symmetrical upload and download speeds . Speeds range from 300 Mbps up to 8 Gbps, depending on the plan .

National Deployment and Coverage

The France Tres Haut Debit Plan, launched in 2013 and overseen by ARCEP and the Mission France Tres Haut Debit, aims for nationwide fiber coverage by 2030 . As of Q4 2025, 40.09 million premises (about 92% of the national stock) are connectable, with 27.1 million subscriptions already active . Rural areas are being progressively connected through Public Initiative Networks (RIP), and the copper network is being gradually phased out, with a national target for full shutdown by 2030 .

Installation and Access

For apartments, fiber is typically run to a building's Optical Branch Point (PBO), and individual units are connected to the PTO, usually free of charge . For houses, installation may require civil engineering work such as trenching or aerial lines, taking 2-4 weeks . ARCEP provides online tools to check fiber eligibility at any address (cartefibre.arcep.fr or maconnexioninternet.arcep.fr), .

Regulatory and Market Aspects

Only FTTH offers can legally be marketed as "fiber" in France, preventing misleading claims about mixed technologies . Major operators include Orange, SFR, Bouygues Telecom, and Free, with entry-level plans starting around EUR23/month . The network is built around Mutualisation Points (PM) where operators interconnect, ensuring competition and service quality .

Advantages Over Copper Networks

Fiber provides higher speeds, symmetrical upload/download, lower latency, and greater stability, unaffected by electromagnetic interference . Compared with ADSL or VDSL, fiber maintains performance regardless of

distance from the exchange. The ongoing copper network phase-out ensures that fiber will become the default broadband technology for all households by 2030 .
