

How to remove fiber optic cable from optical module

Carefully power down the device, identify the connector type, and gently release the latch while pulling the fiber straight out to safely remove it from the optical module.

Safety Precautions

Before attempting removal, follow these safety steps to protect yourself and the equipment:

- o Power down the device: Disconnect the optical module or modem from its electrical source to prevent exposure to infrared laser light and avoid damage to internal electronics .
- o Avoid looking into the fiber port: Never look directly into an active fiber port, as invisible laser light can cause eye injury .
- o Keep the area clean: Dust or debris can damage the fiber tip, so ensure your workspace is free of contaminants .

Identify the Connector Type

Fiber optic connectors vary, and knowing the type is essential for safe removal:

- o SC (Subscriber Connector): Rectangular with a push-pull mechanism, often secured by a plastic tab .
- o LC (Lucent Connector): Smaller, uses a clip or latch that must be squeezed to release .
- o Other types include ST and FC, which may have twist or bayonet mechanisms .

Removal Procedure

- o Stabilize the device: Hold the optical module or modem steady with one hand to prevent movement while disconnecting the cable .
- o Release the latch: Depending on the connector type, either depress the tab (SC) or squeeze the clip (LC) to unlock the connector .
- o Pull straight out: Gently pull the connector along its axis without twisting or bending the cable. Avoid applying lateral force to prevent fiber damage .
- o Cap the connectors: Immediately place protective caps on both the fiber end and the module port to prevent contamination .

Post-Removal Checks

- o Inspect the fiber end-face for dirt or scratches using approved cleaning tools if necessary .
- o If the connector is stuck or damaged, contact a certified technician or your ISP rather than forcing removal .



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Following these steps ensures the fiber optic cable and optical module remain intact, maintains signal integrity, and protects your eyes from potential laser hazards.
