- o Check Connections: Tighten all screws and terminals. Use a multimeter to verify continuity, correct voltage, and absence of short circuits .
- o Final Inspection: Ensure wires are neatly arranged, insulated, and secured. Confirm that all breakers and protective devices are properly installed .
