The tools used to crimp cables in patch panels are called network cable crimpers or crimping pliers, and for keystone jacks or 110/ Krone-style patch panels, punch-down tools are used.

Network Cable Crimpers

Network cable crimpers are specialized pliers used to attach connectors, such as RJ45 plugs, to the ends of network cables. They work by mechanically compressing the connector onto the cable, ensuring that the individual wires make proper contact with the metal pins inside the plug . Modern crimpers are often multifunctional, combining cutting, stripping, and crimping in a single tool, which simplifies the assembly of custom patch cables . These are particularly useful when creating flexible patch cables or custom-length cables for network installations.

Punch-Down Tools

For patch panels that use keystone jacks or 110/ Krone-style connections, a punch-down tool is used instead of a crimper. This tool inserts and secures individual wires into the slots of the patch panel or keystone jack, cutting off excess wire and ensuring a reliable electrical connection . Punch-down tools come in different types, including impact tools and insertion tools, and are essential for structured cabling in professional network setups.
