Yes, the neutral wire is connected to ground, but only at one specific location: your home's main electrical panel. Inside that panel, the neutral bus bar and the ground bus bar are physically linked through a metal strap or screw called a bonding jumper. This practice is essential. The electrical system relies on two distinct conductors: the neutral wire and the ground wire. These two conductors serve fundamentally different safety functions, even though they may sometimes connect.
