Single-Mode vs. Multimode Fiber

Single-mode fiber (SMF), particularly OS2, dominates long-distance and high-bandwidth applications such as telecom backbones and undersea cables due to its small core (8-10um) and ability to transmit data over tens of kilometers with minimal signal loss. Multimode fiber (MMF), especially OM3 and OM4, is most popular for short- to medium-distance applications like enterprise networks and data centers. These fibers have larger cores (50-62.5um) and support high-speed transmission (10G/40G/100G) over distances up to 550 meters, making them cost-effective for indoor deployments.

- o MTP/MPO cables: Multi-fiber push-on connectors are widely used in data centers for high-density, high-bandwidth connections, supporting rapid deployment and scalability.
