- o **Testing:** After connection, test the fiber link using an Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) or visual fault locator to ensure signal integrity and performance .
- o **Labeling and Documentation:** Label both ends of the fiber cable and document the connection layout for future maintenance and troubleshooting .
