

Which city built Ghana's first steel-framed bridge

The Adomi Bridge (originally the Volta Bridge) is a latticed steel arch suspension bridge crossing the Volta River at Atimpoku in Ghana in West Africa. This iconic bridge, constructed in the 1960s, not only connects the Eastern and Volta Regions but also holds immense historical and cultural significance for Ghana. Its conception arose from the. The construction of the Adomi Bridge began in 1956 and was completed in 1957. It provides the main road passage, just south of.

Ghana's longest bridge - the Adomi Bridge - was re-opened to traffic last Saturday after 22 months of rehabilitation works. The Adomi Bridge, which connects Atimpoku in the Eastern

The bridge was designed by William Brown, a British civil engineer, and built by the British construction firm Costain West Africa. The Adomi Bridge spans across the Volta River near the town of Atimpoku,

The Adomi Bridge at Atimpoku in the Asuogyaman District of the Eastern Region was the essential project that bridged the socio-economic, cultural, and political gaps between the north, south, central,

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The completion of the Adomi Bridge in 1965 was a momentous occasion for Ghana, celebrated as a symbol of national progress and technological advancement. The bridge, named after the late J.K.

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While the design was done by Williams W. Brown, the actual construction was headed by famous engineering firm, Sir William Halcrow and Partners which is now known as Halcrow Group Ltd.

The Adomi Bridge, located around Akosombo and lying over the Volta River, was first opened in 1957. Contrary to common knowledge that it is the longest bridge in the country, it isn't; it is only about
